Message from the Dean

The VCU School of Education's work has reached new heights in the 2018-2019 academic year, thanks to our fantastic faculty, staff and students and with the continuous support of our donors and friends. Our accomplishments showcase our razor sharp focus on serving our communities, schools, families and children, especially in urban and high needs environments.

Together, we have received approval for five new undergraduate programs, which are launching Fall 2019. These programs will help us address critical shortage areas in Virginia schools, and particularly in urban, high needs schools in the Richmond area.



NEW PROGRAMS ADDRESS THE TEACHER SHORTAGE

The VCU School of Education launched **five new undergraduate degrees** fall 2019, preparing students for teaching careers in early childhood education, elementary and secondary education, health and physical education, and special education.

- · The B.S.Ed. in Early Childhood Education and Teaching
- · The B.S.Ed. in Elementary Education and Teaching
- The B.S.Ed. in Secondary Education and Teaching, with a concentration in Engineering Education
- · The B.S.Ed. in Health and Physical Education
- · The B.S.Ed. in Special Education and Teaching/General

In addition, the VCU School of Education recognizes the importance of multiple pathways for entry into the teaching profession and for attaining teaching licensure credentials. To that end, the VCU SOE Pathways to Teaching: Career Switcher Program is an accelerated educator preparation program that will move prospective teachers into the classroom early, as a full-time teacher, earning a salary, while working with experienced teachers and university education faculty.

The programs are part of a statewide effort to address a critical shortage of teachers across Virginia.













RESEARCH AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Our research and community engagement are conducted with attention to issues of social justice, equity, and diversity. The VCU School of Education has seen a consistent increase in external awards over the last decade, winning grants from the likes of the U.S. Department of Education, the Social Security Administration, the Department of Health and Human Services, the Institute of Education Sciences, the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services and more.

THE WORK OF OUR CENTERS

At the VCU School of Education, our work doesn't stop at the classroom door. Our seven affiliated centers and institutes serve as our arms out into the community, putting the research and learning being done in our programs and departments to use where its needed most: right here in the city of Richmond. From helping individuals with disabilities find work to creating city-wide sporting events, these groups provide opportunities for you to expand your education in ways you won't find at other schools.











VCU SOE STRATEGIC PLAN

With the help of internal and external stakeholders, the VCU School of Education developed a new vision, mission, values and strategic plan that will lead the work of the school from 2019 to 2022. The themes of the plan and priorities of the school are student success, national prominence, collective urban and regional transformation, and diversity driving excellence.



CHINA PARTNERSHIPS

We're making an impact on education. On a global scale. The VCU School of Education is committed to promoting education beyond our borders. As part of that, we're proud to introduce our China partnerships initiative — a collaborative opportunity for faculty and students here and in China to work and learn together in the areas of research, teaching, service and professional development.

Several elements of this initiative are well underway, including an early childhood education/ early elementary practicum and a preK-20 program, both hosted by SOE and scheduled for spring and summer 2019, respectively. Planned collaboration opportunities also include teaching opportunities for SOE faculty in China, a research conference at Jiangnan University in the fall, and a joint international research lab.

INNOVATIVE TEACHER PIPELINE



A professional learning process for pre-service teachers to engage in co-curricular course work along with seminar training and career coaching focused on in-depth implicit bias training. The aim of the Innovative Teacher Pipeline is to prepare teachers to best support educational excellence & equity, particularly for Black and LatinX school children.

AACTE™ HOLMES SCHOLARS PROGRAM @VCU

The program supports students from historically underrepresented communities enrolled in doctoral programs in education. VCU's Holmes Scholars Program is strategically focused on preparing scholars for R1 and R2 academic positions.
